



WALCOTT VILLAGE HALL

After a pretty miserable 2020 so far Walcott Village Hall committee would like to invite you to come along and have some fun at the Walcott Village Show on Saturday 5th September from 1-4pm.

There are 74 classes across 6 categories:- Photography, Fruit, Vegetables, Flowers, Home Produce and arts and crafts. A certificate will be awarded to all winners. To enter pick up a form from outside the village hall, Mace shop or print off from the village hall facebook page. You can enter as many classes as you wish at just 50p per entry. All entries may be dropped off at the hall between 6 and 8pm on Fri 4th or between 8 and 11am on Sat 5th.

All Covid19 guidelines in place.

Supporting the village show also gives you a great opportunity to come and admire the new ceiling, lighting and insulation project that has just been completed. This project has been the result of a lot of hard work from the committee. The project costs were over £20,000 and although the committee managed to secure around £12,000 (9,100 from funding applications, just over 2,000 from donations, and fundraising, and two committee members bare all on Naked Gardening day raising another 500) Covid came along and we had to cancel many of the additional fundraising events we had planned. The Poachers Pocket had named us as their charity for their fundraising for 2020 as well but again it all had to be cancelled. In order to complete the project as soon as lockdown allowed and not to disrupt or delay the return of our regular classes and activities the committee has dipped into the savings pot and our small business grant but as these funds are to cover loss of income it needs to be replaced. As soon as it is safe to do so the committee and the pub will be resuming fundraising events to replace the borrowed funds,so please support these as much as you are able.

All profits from the village show will go towards this cause.

Happisburgh RNLI Station is looking for a volunteer to take on the role of Deputy Inshore Lifeboat Mechanic. There may be the opportunity in the future to progress to Station Mechanic, which would involve working 15 hours per week on station.

This role would be working alongside the station's Mechanic, learning the RNLI way of keeping a station and it's assets / boats / launch and recovery kit in top form ready for our role of saving lives at sea.

You would carry out planned maintenance and repairs, report defects, order stores, maintain records and assist the coast technicians when they visit the lifeboat station.

Training will be provided in line with the relevant Competency Framework and should be maintained in order to perform this role.

What you will get from this role:

- * joining a motivated and enthusiastic team
- * meeting new people within your local community
- * having the satisfaction of giving back
- * developing your skills and experience within the supportive environment of the RNLI

What you will need for this role:

- * be a good team player
- * have good interpersonal skills
- * have the ability to learn new skills
- * have an understanding of safe working practices in a lifeboat station or similar
- * have an understanding of mechanical/electrical systems


